Offering space as a service** will be the industry standard with office as the workplace starting to be increasingly seen as a flexible business service that actively supports growth rather than a fixed and often financially onerous physical product. This repositioning is alluring to the tenant and will be seen as the demand default
- 3. Mobility and mergers will underpin occupier activity with M&A initiatives and talent searches intensifying and occupier portfolios incorporating markets and submarkets that were not considered conducive for enterprise. Essentially what this means is there will be a conscious movement towards workspaces that are seen as being closer to talent pools, while offering heightened options in terms of amenities, service and infrastructure that will serve in the retention of talent.

Technology takes the wheel to tweak perceptions on offices of the future even as businesses take a leaf out of the hospitality playbook to present value adds to staff with access to wellness centres and high-tech conferencing facilities

OFFICE BIOLOGY:
Towards sustainable and ergonomic work environments

Our cognitive cogs, and the diversity between them, are being observed to be equally important to our physical needs in the workplace. In order to build a strong employer brand for the future, companies have to offer work environments adapted to both our bodies and our minds.

By creating ergonomic workplaces that actively make users move around, like sit/stand desks and ergonomic FreeMotion-office chairs the risks for work related injuries are effectively reduced. What about the mind? How do we offer a mindful workplace when technology is evolving at a ferocious pace, turning the working situation upside down for most people? Research shows that boring offices that do not work are a downright health hazard and result in more days off work sick. Our surroundings have the greatest impact on our brains. In a mindful workplace where people are in focus, there is an understanding that soft values play a vital role when it comes to wellbeing and that design and psychology are interlinked.

The obvious solution is to putthe requirements and needs of the indi-

vidual employee in focus, letting people choose their own combinations of interactions and environments at work. To avoid tech fatigue we could take lessons from a company like Google that has decided to introduce technology-free meetings where both laptops and mobiles are not allowed.

However, this formula only stands true if implemented correctly, with the trick being to put a lid on the idea of hiring too many community managers.

Keep your management team tight. Besides, according to a survey by Deskmag, an average coworking space utilization rate is 1.2 members per desk, which proves that entrepreneurs aim to get more value out of the available desks.

Yet, this does not mean that the quality of service offerings is sacrificed. Coworking space owners just need to listen to members, study demand, analyse data and optimise the utilisation.

TECH-ENABLED FUTURE:
Sensors to track high-density workspaces

The pandemic has expedited the usage of technology to map workspaces and provide solutions where none were deemed necessary. New technologies, for instance are being implemented to reduce common touch points with tenants and landlords tracking office usage with sensors that determine heavily trafficked areas. Being used even before the pandemic, these same sensors can now be used to monitor, track and determine the areas that are most in need of deep cleaning, where density is too high, and which workstations are underused and could perhaps be repurposed.

ADDING VALUE: Hospitality the new normal

Taking inspiration from the hospitality industry, workspaces in a post-Covid world will increasingly look towards maximizing their value propositions for tenants, offering not just workspaces but also partnering with professionals who deliver hospitality and amenity models. From high-tech conferencing facilities and chic in-office restaurants

to fitness centres and wellness offerings, workspaces will begin to mirror the hospitality sector more and more in efforts to raise the bar on 360 degree value offerings to employees during and even after office hours.

A study by Canada-based investment management firm, Colliers International notes suburban operator growth being driven by large scale occupiers executing flexible working policies for their employees based in decentralised locations — driven by larger cohorts of aging millennials moving to suburbs, and enterprises embracing more decentralised portfolio strategies.
